As an integral part of our team, the Arts Director plays a highly visible role in the implementation of many of our camp activities fostering campers' creativity, artistic expression, and passion for the arts.

### Our Ideal Candidate:

Our ideal candidate for this position has experience running art programs in an outdoor recreation/afterschool/educational setting & the ability to inspire and motivate junior staff to implement engaging art programming for youth. In addition to executing daily programming the Art Director will mentor, supervise, and manage speciality counselors within their department. Ideally you are First Aid and CPR certified, have a passion for experiential learning experiences, and thrive in a high-paced and flexible camp environment.

### Description of the Role:

#### **Program Planning**

- Develop and implement a comprehensive art program that caters to the age, interests, and abilities of campers including textile arts, painting, claywork, & camp crafts.
- Create a schedule of art activities throughout the camp session & support evening programming as necessary.

#### **Staff Supervision**

- Supervise speciality counselors within the umbrella of the Art department & assigned cabin counselors; providing mentorship & valuable feedback to help junior staff support campers in all aspects of camp life.
- Conduct staff meetings & training sessions as needed within the scope of the department.

#### **Equipment and Facilities**

- Responsible for the management of art materials & facilities at camp including ensuring equipment/facilities are safe, well-maintained, and in good working order.
- Inventory materials & manage supply orders to implement art programming at camp.

#### **Safety & First Aid**

- Ensure safety procedures are being followed in the implementation of art programs.

#### **Communication**

- Maintain open and clear communication with camp leadership, staff, and campers.

#### **Emergency Response**

- Be prepared for emergencies at camp & coordinate with camp leadership to respond appropriately to emergency situations.

**Requirements:** Experience supporting Art operations in a camp setting. Experience working with children.

Background Check. CPR/First Aid certification preferred.
